Old Chièvres Air Base underground fuel tanks to be removed

Belgian Ministry of Defense contractors are removing POL sites 10-1, 10-2 and 10-3, the three Petroleum, Oil and Lubricant semi-underground storage tanks the U.S. Forces stopped using in 2002.

The sites were built in 1953 when the Belgian Forces were still stationed at Chièvres Air Base. These storage tanks were also used when the U.S. took over the base in 1967. When leaks were suspected at POL 10-1 located in front of the single service members quarters in 2002 and because the capacity of the storage was much more than actually needed, the U.S. Forces replaced the use of POL 10-1 by four temporary Self Contained Above Ground (SCAGT) tanks. Around the same time, the U.S. Forces stopped using POL 10-2 and 10-3.

“The project to remove the old POL storages dates from eight years ago,” Nadine Bogaert, project engineer at the Belgian Ministry of Defense, Infrastructure division, said. “There was no environmental emergency to remove them and the project had to be approved by NATO, as well as by the Walloon Region and funds had to be made available,” Bogaert added. “The removal of the tanks is funded by the U.S. as the U.S. Forces were the ones using them at the time,” Marion Guihard, Environmental Scientist at the USAG Benelux Directorate of Public Works, Environmental Division said.

The works that started earlier this week, will be done in three phases.

Phase one will involve cleaning the tanks, emptying all the underground pipes and demolishing the tanks. This will be done from February 11 through March 13 at POL 10-1, from Feb. 17 through March 21 at POL 10-2 and from Feb. 5 through March 3 at POL 10-3.

Phase two will be the excavation of the surrounding soil. During this phase, the community will notice increased traffic of trucks as some 1,000 tons of soil will be evacuated daily, using 10 to 15 trucks transporting the soil to an off post soil treatment plant. This phase will stretch over March and April. Increased traffic will involve the road between Gate 14 and the commercial area

and the road from Gate 14 to the Air Force side of the base.

The last phase will involve the backfilling and installation of a remediation system where needed and will last until the end of June. At POL 10-2 and 3, the excavated soil will be analyzed, and pending the results, a remediation system will be installed. Because of the suspected leaks at POL 10-1, a remediation system will be installed which will treat any potential contamination of the area for as long as needed.

Two other underground fuel storages, POL 10-4 and 10-5, will remain on base. “These storages are no longer active. We have surveyed these storages and they are within standards,” Guihard added.

The next goal is to find a permanent storage location to replace the four temporary Self Contained Above Ground (SCAGT) tanks that were installed to take over the storage from the old POL sites in 2003. The Environmental Division and the Belgian Ministry of Defense, Infrastructure Division are working together to find a long term and permanent solution with the NATO's approval.

Did you know that . . .

Police fired several times in Lens

Monday afternoon at about 2:30 p.m., a police officer on a motorcycle was travelling toward Lombise when he spotted a suspicious car with three people onboard. The French license plate was false. The police officer followed the car and called his station. When his colleagues arrived, the suspected car made a U-turn and occupants threw a vacuum cleaner and emptied a fire extinguisher through the window. Meanwhile, the Lens police established a blockade, the suspects drove straight toward two policemen. That is when the police officer fired. One bullet went into the car door and another bullet went through the window without injuring anyone. The three people were eventually stopped in Lens and arrested. Just prior to being noticed by the police officer, they committed theft in Cambron and are suspected of another burglary in Jurbise.

Amsterdam butcher turns city pigeons into pâté

Around 1,000 Amsterdam city pigeons are being processed into pâté every year, without officials knowing about it, a Dutch newspaper reported last week. A private pest control firm kills around 1,000 pigeons a year on behalf of private firms and home owners and delivers them to a butcher, who turns them into 'game pâté', the paper says. Pigeons are nicknamed 'flying rats' in the Netherlands and have a reputation for eating whatever they can. The butcher told the newspaper that he turns a couple of hundred pigeons into pâté every year and that he is not worried about the health implications. 'We carry out very tight screening on everything that comes in,' he told the newspaper.

Customs to collect unpaid bills

In a period of four months, Belgian customs seized 66 cars after drivers failed to pay their traffic fines. In all 377 motorists who had not paid their traffic fines were stopped. The police are employing a mobile brigade and automatic number plate recognition to identify and apprehend the drivers. A total of €272,000 in unpaid fines were collected between September and December of last year. Belgian customs first started using automatic number plate recognition cameras to check whether drivers had paid their road tax. Today this job is only done by customs in the Brussels Region as in Flanders and Wallonia the regional authorities have taken on this task. But in the entire country the cameras are being used to check the payment of traffic fines, to see whether your vehicle has passed its inspection and is ensured. Customs are deploying 23 different mobile brigades on this job. People unable to pay their fine on the spot have to leave their vehicle with the customs. Belgian customs can seize a vehicle for up to four days. Vehicles are only returned after the payment of the fine. If fines remain unpaid, vehicles can be seized for good and sold to raise cash to cover the fine.

A toll to drive into Brussels?

A survey carried out on behalf the Brussels-Capital Region has found that any toll to reduce traffic levels in the capital would need to be much higher than originally thought if it

were to have any effect. The Brussels-Capital Region commissioned the survey to find out how high the daily price of a toll to travel on the capital's roads would need to be in order to reduce traffic and consequently pollution from motor vehicle exhausts. The survey came up with a figure of €12 a day. The results of this survey and the ones of a second survey on road toll charging will be put before the Brussels Regional Parliament, the capital's 19 municipal authorities and groups representing economic interests before the Brussels Regional Government makes a decision.

Southern Netherlands to demolish 5,000 homes

Almost 5,000 rental houses are to be demolished in southern parts of the Dutch Limburg province over the next three years. The demolition will create a €73m tax advantage for housing corporations, which they will invest in new rental properties. The province hopes an improvement in housing stock will help reverse the population decline in the most southern parts of the Netherlands. Corporations can get a €15,000 cut in a new tax on rental income for every house they demolish.

Rising costs to build the new NATO headquarters

A German news weekly reports that construction of the new NATO headquarters in the Brussels district of Haren is under threat due to rising costs. The cost of building NATO's new HQ, across the road from its current headquarters, is said to be soaring. Recent estimates put the final price tag at over €1 billion. Furthermore, the weekly reports that the building contractors will be unable to keep costs below the upper budget limit of €1.05 billion. Fresh cash will need to be found if work on the new headquarters is to be completed. The magazine says that €245 million extra will be needed to complete the work and that the project won't be completed until more than nine months later than originally planned. The building contractors blame "unforeseen circumstances and stricter safety regulations" for the extra cost and delays. Meanwhile, the main contractor working on the NATO Headquarters has confirmed that more time and money will be needed to complete the work.

Electric super bikes pose problems for officials

A hybrid electric bike which is capable of speeds of up to 45 kilometer per hour (27 miles per hour) is causing a headache for officials in the Netherlands. The Bluelabel Cruiser, which is made in Germany, looks like a tough mountain bike with fat wheels and straight handlebars. It costs over €3,000 and several hundred have already been sold in the Netherlands. Because it can go so fast, the bike should be officially categorized as a moped and limited to a maximum speed of 25 kilometer per hour (15 miles per hour). It should also be officially registered as a vehicle, have third party insurance and blue number plates. The problem is that nobody does that because it is not required for a bike. The Dutch cycling union has organized a meeting to discuss the super bike and how it should be treated in law. A spokesman for the transport ministry said the super bike is currently classed as a bike but from 2017 will be considered a scooter under EU guidelines.


