


Nonappropriated Fund Claims

Sometimes it is obvious when you have a valid claim to file with your local claims office. For example, a distracted Soldier drives a Humvee into your parked car, the military postal service loses your package or an automatic door in an Army office building unexpectedly closes on you breaking your wrist.

However, valid claims aren't limited to injury or damage caused by the Army and its personnel. Valid claims can also arise through the negligent acts of Nonappropriated Fund Instrumentalities and the Army and Air Force Exchange Service.

What are NAFIs? NAFIs are Department of Defense sanctioned programs, typically through MWR, that provide morale, welfare, and recreational programs for military personnel and civilians. Common examples of NAFIs found on-post in Europe include auto skills centers, car washes, bowling alleys, child development centers, clubs, fitness centers, golf clubs, movie theaters, etc. NAFIs do not include concessionaires operating on post like name brand restaurants and specialty stores.

If you have a claim for property damage and/or personal injury caused by the negligent or wrongful act of NAFI / AAFES employee acting within the scope of employment, you must present the claim to your local claims office within two years from the date the incident took place. Alternatively, you must file your claim within two years of the date the negligent or wrongful act reasonably was discovered.

The proper format for filing a claim is a completed Standard Form 95. The SF 95 can be picked up from your local claims office. An online version is available for completion at <http://www.gsa.gov> at "Forms Library."

Although all claims submitted will be thoroughly investigated by your local claims office, it is important for you to provide detailed facts that form the basis of your claim. You should list the incident location and identify all persons involved to the best of your ability. Additionally, you should attach the police report/incident complaint report, if you have one and submit written statements from witnesses, if applicable.

Furthermore, make sure the SF95 states a definite sum of money for the claimed damages. Failure to provide it on the SF95 could invalidate or delay the filing of your claim. Remember that all SF95 forms submitted must be dated and signed. The more information you provide to the claims office about the claimed incident, the faster you will receive a decision from your claims office. Keep in mind that the claims office will forward all NAFI and AAFES claims to the appropriate agency for payment.

The laws and regulations surrounding NAFI claims are complex; your Military Claims Office is standing by to assist potential NAFI claimants.

Update your contact data in MilConnect

Last year the Army completed its migration of more than 1.4 million users to DoD Enterprise Email. That transition provided the Army with several key capabilities including increased information security, more email storage, and an integrated Global Address List. The GAL is a comprehensive address list consisting of everyone in the Department of Defense who has been issued a Common Access Card. Previously, GAL information was populated from multiple data feeds. In order to streamline the process, the DEE GAL is now populated from only one authoritative data feed. This data feed is from the Defense Manpower Data Center, which hosts personnel data for everyone in the DOD. Army personnel now have the ability to update their GAL contact information using the MilConnect portal. In addition to providing contact information, the MilConnect portal provides access to information regarding each person's family, their benefits, health care eligibility, personnel records, and more. In April, Army Vice Chief of Staff Gen. John F. Campbell Jr. expects all Army personnel to update their contact data such as commercial phone number, DSN phone number, office address, duty organization, etc. and he also expects organizations to incorporate updates to MilConnect as part of their in-processing and annual record update procedures.



